Hello readers,


Apologies that the islander is a bit sparce this week! Completely forgot that I was editing!

General Election – Thursday 20 October 2022 How to cast your vote

On **Thursday 20 October 2022** you will have the opportunity of casting your vote for the candidates you would like to represent you on the Island Council. There are five seats available on the Council and six candidates: Kerry Ann Benjamin, Kyla Benjamin, Kenneth Antony Godkin, Douglas Gordon Miller, Alan Herbert Nicholls and Laura Marie Shearer.

Please note that you may only vote if your name appears on the current Electoral Register [dated 31 August 2022] and you may vote only at the polling station which appears against your name: Saints Members Club in Georgetown; Two Boats Club; the NAAFI at Travellers Hill; and the US Base Library. Polling stations will be open from 8am to 8pm and each will display notices to show where to enter and exit. Please do not enter the polling station/area if there is already another voter inside.

On entering, go directly to the officials' table. The Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer will confirm your name and polling station against the Electoral Register. If the details are correct, you will be handed a ballot paper that bears the official stamp of the polling station and a line will be drawn through your entry on the Electoral Register to show that this has been done.

How to register your vote:

- Take the ballot paper to the voting area and mark it with up to five crosses opposite the names of the candidates you wish to vote for. No other mark or signature should be placed on the ballot paper.
- Fold the ballot paper so as to conceal who you have voted for but so that the official stamp on the back remains visible. Show the Presiding or Assistant Presiding Officer the stamp then place your ballot paper into the ballot box.
- Immediately leave the polling station by the designated exit.

The Presiding and Assistant Presiding Officer are there to help if you need it. However, if you have any questions before Thursday, please contact either of the following:

Ascension Island Magistrates Court

The following case was heard in the Magistrates' Court on Wednesday, 12^h October 2022.

Mr Joseph Alexander VARNADO of United States Air Force Base, ASCENSION ISLAND was charged that between the 27th and 29th June 2022 along the path at Redhill, United States Air Force Base, Ascension Island, contrary to section 23(1)(b) of the Public Health (Coronavirus) (Temporary Provisions) Regulations, 2022, he failed without reasonable excuse to comply with a restriction imposed under regulation 13 of the Public Health (Coronavirus) (Temporary Provisions) Regulations, 2022, by leaving his isolation accommodation and going for a walk.

Mr Varnado pleaded Guilty and received a fine of £560.00 and ordered to pay £50.00 in court costs.



MV Helena - Monday, 12 December 2022





The MV Helena is expected to call at Ascension on Monday, 12 December.

Freight and small parcels will be accepted in the warehouse from 0800 hrs to 0900 hrs on Saturday, 29 October for those departing on Sunday, 6 November's Airlink Flight.

All bookings for vehicles and containers will close at 1200 hrs on Monday, 5 December.

Freight and small parcels for those working on the US Base only will be accepted from 0830 hrs to 1030 hrs on Tuesday, 6 December.

All remaining freight and small parcels will be accepted from 1100 hrs to 1300 hrs on Tuesday, 6 December.

Frozen goods will be accepted from 0730 hrs to 0830 hrs on Friday, 9 December.

In accordance with the Customs (Export Control) Regulations 2010, it is an offence to export fish from the island without a valid export permit. Persons exporting fish are required to purchase an export permit from the Post Office prior to delivering your boxes to the warehouse. The permit must be produced on delivery of goods. You are also reminded that a **maximum** of 10 kilograms of fish **per person** may be exported. A fisheries officer and a customs officer will be present at the warehouse when checks will be made on all frozen goods. All boxes containing fish should be delivered unsealed.

Please note that in addition to being sold at the Shipping Office, the AWS freezer boxes are also available at the Georgetown Post Office.

VOTE FOR ALAN NICHOLLS



I guess that by now most of you, who are intending to vote tomorrow, have already decided on who you are going to cast your vote for, I just hope that you have chosen wisely.

For those of you who have decided not to vote, I would ask the simple question, why have you come to this decision? Is it because you think that there are no suitable candidates or that your interests will not be effectively represented on the Island Council? In this respect, I would just like to remind you that, although five councillors are needed to make up the Island Council you do not have to vote for five persons — you can vote for any number of persons, up to a maximum of five, if you should so wish to do so. In fact you can vote for only one person (which I hope will be me), if you should think that there are no other suitable candidates. So please reconsider your decision, if you have decided not to vote, and go along to a polling station tomorrow, and vote for the person or persons, who you would like to represent you on the Island Council for the next three years. The process of voting is very simple and will not take up much of your time.

By now you will be well aware of who the candidates are for tomorrow's General Election. You will also have probably noticed that the majority of the candidates are new, with only two candidates (including myself) having prior experience from the previous Island Council. You might be thinking that a totally new council might not be a bad idea, however, and with the greatest respect, I would suggest that a totally new council will need a considerable amount of time to familiarise themselves with Government business (including finance) and Council processes and procedures, whereas, if elected, I will be able to hit the ground running. As I said in my letter to you last week, it is important to have some continuity, so that unfinished Council business can be properly concluded. Having the necessary background knowledge, will enable these matters to be completed in a timely manner.

When considering who to vote for tomorrow, please consider this: (a) It is important to have experienced and outspoken councillors who are prepared to challenge the government on all matters that affect the wellbeing of everyone on this island; (b) I am confident that I have considerable relevant experience and ability, and am certainly not afraid of putting this into practice for the wellbeing of everyone on this Island; (c) I have a certain amount of experience in financial matters (I was also a member of the previous Finance Committee), and will therefore be amply suited to hold the Government to account on this subject.

To enable to me to put all of my experience, knowledge and ability to use, for the benefit of all of you, I will need your vote tomorrow. So please vote, and you certainly will not be disappointed if you **vote for**:

VOTE LAURA SHEARER FOR COUNCIL



My name is Laura Shearer and I am the Seabird Scientist for AIG. I have been on island for 4 years and I see myself remaining on Ascension long-term. Over the last 4 years, I have fully integrated myself into the island community- volunteering with the Sea Rescue team for 2.5yrs, coaching the teenager's football club for 3yrs as well as becoming treasurer for both island dive clubs.

Becoming a member of the island council is something I have thought long and hard about and feel now is the most suitable time. Living on island for several years, I now feel I understand how the island works and what is important to the community. I have spoken to previous councillors,

read the minutes of meetings over the last few years and familiarised myself with recent legislation and policy changes. My motivation for becoming a councillor is to work towards building partnerships and improving opportunities for the island to become a more prosperous and happy place to live and work.

In the build up to running for council, I have spoken to a number of people across the island to find out what is important to them. A recurring theme was improvement of mental health provisions. For several years I was a community carer, providing support to vulnerable adults in their own home including those with severe mental health issues so this is an area in which I have experience. As a councillor, I would be keen to work alongside AIG to continue raising awareness and ensuring that people feel their mental health needs are being met.

I would also like to see improvements made to the settlements and in recreational spaces. I would like to look at options to make public areas actually work for people- improved lighting, more seating options in popular areas, better road signage. I think it is important to look after our island, our heritage and take pride in our home.

Should I be elected, I plan to organise regular drop-in sessions to allow everyone's voice to be heard. I can be contacted in a number of ways of which you feel most comfortable- send me an email, catch me around town, I am always ready to listen and hear what is important to you. I value confidentiality, honesty and trust and I commit myself to listen to the expectations and concerns of islanders. I will work hard to ensure that community feedback is heard to ensure the best future for Ascension.

Public Consultation on Amendment to National Protected Area at Long Beach

End of public consultation period

On Friday 07 October, a public consultation on a draft Policy to amend the boundaries of the National Protected Area at Long Beach concluded.

The proposed change is driven by the fact that the only suitable site for an urgently required new wastewater plant for Georgetown lies just within the land side edge of the current protected area. In order to allow the wastewater treatment plant to be constructed, the boundary of the Long Beach Nature Reserve would need to be adjusted.

An environmental impact assessment for new wastewater treatment plant has been carried out by the Conservation and Fisheries Directorate. This has shown that, with appropriate mitigation in place, the construction and operation of the treatment plant at the preferred location would not have a negative impact on the natural features of the Long Beach Nature Reserve.

Following completion of the consultation period on Friday 07 October, no responses were received and therefore the proposed changes was accepted.

Georgetown Water Works Treatment Plant

Work to commence shortly

Next week, work will begin on a long planned project to replace the water works treatment plant at Georgetown. As the location of the new site is immediately adjacent to the current one, it is anticipated that there will be no noticeable disruption to the public during the works.

Initial work will start on 17 October with the clearance of the site, located next to the existing plant. Groundworks and installation of services will follow and will continue until the end of January.

The new plant is a closed system in separate units and will arrive via the October FIRS. It will then be installed in the coming months with the commissioning of the plant scheduled for February 2023.

The need to replace both the Georgetown and Two Boats waste water plants was identified in 2017 and the replacement of both has now been enabled thanks to joint funding from both the UK government and AIG.

The waste water plant replacement projects are being managed by Project Manager Frikkie Myburgh and the work required for the replacement of both plants is being provided by members of the Operations and Facilities Directorate.

Further updates will be issued on both plant replacement programmes as and when they occur.

Weekly COVID-19 Statistics

Monitoring of community spread continues

On Monday 08 August, Ascension recorded its first case of COVID-19 within the community. Since then, further cases of COVID-19 have been recorded and authorities are monitoring the spread of virus.

In order to ensure the public has a clear picture of infection rates within the territory, weekly infection statistics are being published during the period of transitioning to 'living with COVID-19'.

As of Friday 14 October 2022, the total number of positive results from tests conducted by, or registered with, a healthcare worker at one of the three testing sites is as follows:


These figures are based on results of tests conducted at each of these sites. However, the test site may not necessarily reflect the primary accommodation location of the person that tested positive.

Between Saturday 08 October and Friday 14 October, the following number of daily positive results from tests conducted by, or registered with, a healthcare worker was recorded:

As of Friday 14 October, there has been a total of one critically ill patient, who had tested positive for COVID-19, admitted to Georgetown Hospital. They have since been medically evacuated for further treatment off island.

The number of confirmed weekly positive results is as follows:



All members of the public are encouraged to monitor their own health for signs of possible infection. If you believe you have symptoms consistent with possible COVID-19 infection you should arrange to take a test at your relevant medical facility and follow the guidance in place. Guidance can be found online at www.ascension.gov.ac/public-document/living-with-covid-19 and is available through your employer, local medical clinic and Georgetown Hospital.

If you test positive, you should isolate for five days. After this time, you should end your isolation once you feel well. A test is not required to end isolation.

Authorities are monitoring the ongoing spread of the virus and the current guidance will remain in effect until they are satisfied that the daily positive incidence rate indicates that the peak of the spread has been passed.
